# FOUNDERS' REMARKS



Thank you for being here. Your presence at Chai Life Productions' second show means more to us than we can express.

Chai Life was founded with a simple but urgent mission: to uplift Jewish creators, Jewish stories, and Jewish causes through art. Our first production, *Joseph*, explored Jewish narrative. *The Last Yiddish Speaker*, by Deborah Zoe Laufer, reaches even deeper—into identity, memory, and the fragile question of safety.

In a world where hate crimes are rising, where an openly anti-Israeli candidate now leads New York City, and where other anti-Semitic voices found new platforms and new audiences, this play lands with a resonance we wish it didn't have.

Many in our community are asking questions we never imagined would feel relevant again: "Could I be forced to leave my home?" "Who would stand with me?" "How do we pass on our heritage when visibility feels dangerous?" Perhaps Laufer sensed this tremor in the world long before it reached the surface.

And yet, this story is not ours alone. The play also echoes the experiences of many marginalized communities—those who have been silenced, erased, or pushed to the edges. It invites all of us to listen, to reflect, and to imagine something better.

To our extraordinary creative team—Zelda, Shula, Laura, Scott, Dorothy, Derek, Sean, Tracy, Byron, Moira, Paije, Anastasia, Asher, Mila, Jeff—and to our cherished volunteers, generous donors, prolific journalists, and remarkable cast, Galya, Ari, Reva and Jonathan: Thank You! Your resilience, artistry, and heart have carried this production from first rehearsal to opening night.

# DIRECTOR'S NOTES



*The Last Yiddish Speaker* by Deborah Laufer is a cautionary tale. Given the events of the past months playing out in the news, it is not as far-fetched as one may imagine.

We have become so polarized, on both sides of the spectrum, and this has led to the demonization of those who do not subscribe to our way of life.

We have lost our tolerance of others, and refuse, or are afraid to engage in meaningful conversation about challenging subjects.

Dialogue is the only way forward to the truth. It offers opportunities to try our theories on others without fear of reproach, or punishment. It breeds a spirit of give and take. Until such time as we can set aside the pressures of social media, and news outlets designed to enrage our sensibilities, we will be doomed to descend deeper into our respective echo chambers, and farther away from each other.

My grandparents escaped from Russia and Romania. They were curious about life, and taught me the value of being able to listen. I have struggled with this in my own life, but understand that if we are unable to open our ears, we cannot open our minds.

*The Last Yiddish Speaker* reminds us of the need to recognize the humanity in each of us; and to tolerate our differences to build a better society where all may flourish.

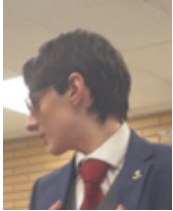
## Mitch Barnes (Sound Design)

## Zelda Dean (Director)

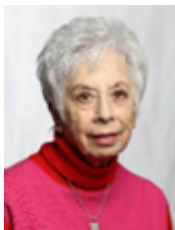
