

FOUNDERS' REMARKS



We feel so privileged that you have joined us at Chai Life Production's first show! From the bottom of our hearts, we thank you!

"Joseph" is a very appropriate musical to produce as our launch. It is about a human being endowed with faith who ascends by moving from passivity to activity through the simple act of interpreting dreams. In many ways, it reflects the journey we have been on in bringing this production to you.

For 40 years, Calgary has been without a Jewish theatre company. It was an act of coordinated dreaming and faith that moved us to take the leap and say "action". We had setbacks, yet overcame them. We could have delayed the launch, yet we persisted. So many factors to consider: A live band, difficult music, a large cast, a robust crew, expensive rights, a demanding rehearsal schedule, a children's choir, and these were to be achieved through unpaid volunteers. Even a seasoned theatre company would find this musical challenging to stage and produce, let alone a fledgling one such as ours.

Another main theme of Joseph is about unity. It is about the brothers who turned on each other who finally discover how to be there for one another. This musical is happening because of all of us being there for one another. We have only a profound indebtedness and gratitude to the city's sprawling theatre community's existing directors and designers who committed themselves to this launch.

To Director Sean Anderson, Music Directors Donna Pearson and Erin Pelz, Choreographer Krista Willot, Rehearsal and Performance Pianist Deb Finkleman, Stage Manager Meredith Anderson, Costume Designer Yvonne Ustick, Lighting Engineer Derek Wilkinson, Sound Engineer Byron Hynes, Prop Masters Linda Garshman along with Gwen Stewart, Make-Up/Hair Designer Paije Hartwick, and Marketing Team Asher and Mila Magri, the volunteers for our fundraiser, the dozens of donors, journalists, and all the adult and children cast, who week after week stayed united on course, absorbing the bumps - thank you for this privilege to witness your talents and contributions to our dream.


Joseph Fernando (Ensemble)




Donna Pearson (Music Director)

Dustin Port (Pharaoh, Ensemble)




